Thanksgiving has been celebrated in the United States since colonial times. Each year, it takes place on the fourth Thursday in November, a tradition that was officially declared a national holiday by President Abraham Lincoln in 1863.

While the well-known story of the "First Thanksgiving" — a
1621 harvest feast shared by colonists and Indigenous peoples
— is more myth than fact, the idea of gathering together in
peace to share a meal has inspired the holiday for generations.
In reality, Thanksgiving likely draws from many harvest and
gratitude celebrations that existed long before that 1621
event, both among Indigenous communities and around the
world.

Veteran's Day

Veterans Day is a holiday in the United States that honors all the men and women who have served in the military to protect our country. It is celebrated every year on November 11th to thank veterans for their service and sacrifices. The day originally began as "Armistice Day" to mark the end of World War I in 1918, but later it was changed to honor all veterans from every branch of the military. People celebrate by attending parades, visiting veterans, and taking part in ceremonies to show appreciation for their bravery and dedication.
