Ms. Deborah Kingsberry- In 2010, Ms. Kingsberry continued her impactful work by authoring numerous Department of Education TRIO grants and founding the Academic Institute of Central Carolina (A.I.C.C.). As Executive Director, she led the organization's growth to include four TRIO programs—two Upward Bound programs, Educational Talent Search, and Educational Opportunity Centers—serving over 1,700 participants annually.

Her journey began as an Upward Bound student in South Bend, and she often referred to herself as "the Poster Child" for TRIO, sharing her inspiring story on both local and national stages over the years.

KEY TIPS FOR SUCCESS

Tips for Students

- Stay Organized: Clean out lockers and backpacks weekly to avoid losing assignments.
- Use a Planner: Track deadlines for assignments and upcoming projects to prevent last-minute stress.
- Manage Time: Break down large projects into smaller, manageable tasks.
- Focus in Class: Pay close attention during class time to reduce the need for extra study time at home.
- Prioritize Health: Ensure 8–10 hours of sleep per night and maintain a balanced diet for energy.
- Seek Support: Do not hesitate to ask teachers for help with academic or social challenges.
- Get Involved: Participate in school clubs or sports to improve school engagement.

Tips for Parents

- Encourage Independence: Allow students to contact teachers first regarding concerns before intervening.
- Build a Support Network: Connect with other parents for advice on navigating this stage.
- Provide Structure: Help establish a consistent routine for studying and relaxation.

IN THE LATE 1970S, THE TRIO COMMUNITY HELPED ESTABLISH THE IDEA OF THE "FIRST-GENERATION COLLEGE STUDENT." AS CONGRESS PREPARED TO REAUTHORIZE THE HIGHER EDUCATION ACT OF 1965, LEADERS PROPOSED MAKING THIS A UNIVERSAL ELIGIBILITY CRITERION FOR TRIO PROGRAMS. THIS HELPED RECOGNIZE STUDENTS WHO ARE THE FIRST IN THEIR FAMILIES TO ATTEND COLLEGE AND PAVED THE WAY FOR GREATER SUPPORT AND OPPORTUNITIES.
